
Elders Corner:





Healthy Recipe

Chicken Gumbo In A Pumpkin

Boil chicken quarters, approximately 45 minutes then remove skin and bones and return to pot. Cut up celery and carrots into 1 inch chunks and add to pot with 3 cups of rice and 6 cups of chicken stock. Season to taste. Bring to a boil then simmer for 30 minutes or until rice is dry and fluffy. Add to the pumpkin, serve, and enjoy.

Pumpkin Preparation

Cut a lid from the top at an angle to make sure the lid doesn't fall into the pumpkin. Remove seeds and pulp from 5-6 inch pumpkin then bake for 20 minutes. Add chicken and other ingredients topping with crumbled crackers. Bake again for 10 minutes and serve.

Nominations must be returned to the CVIH office **PRIOR to 5:00 PM on Friday, November 13, 2015**. Nominations can be mailed; but must be received by 5:00 pm on **Friday, November 15, 2015**.

- A) **One (1) Director** shall be elected by secret ballot by the Indians of the following areas and show proof of residence: **AREA 3 – Big Sandy Rancheria, Auberry, Prather, Friant.**
- B) **NOMINEE:** All members of the Board of Directors shall be adult American Indians of at least ¼ blood quantum; must be residents in the area and show proof of residence they represent for 6 months prior to appointment or election and must be California Indians or members of a federally recognized tribe.
- C) **DUTIES & COMPENSATION:** To be conscious of HEALTH NEEDS of the INDIAN PEOPLE, and be able to aid in development of programs to meet these needs. Be available for monthly Board Meetings, and further commitment to local communities and statewide board if needed. The Directors shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for authorized expenses of attending all meetings.
- D) **ARTICLE 6.3.6 OF CVIH BY-LAWS: QUALIFICATIONS**
All members of the Board of Directors shall be adult American Indians of at least ¼ blood quantum; must be residents in the area and show proof of residence they represent for 6 months prior to appointment or election and must be California Indians or members of a federally recognized tribe; Immediate family members of the Board Members may not serve on the Board of Directors; Immediate family members of Staff Members may not serve on the Board of Directors during their employment with CVIH or for 1 full year following their final date of employment.

NEW BOARD MEMBERS WILL HAVE A BACKGROUND CHECK CONDUCTED BY CVIH STAFF IN ACCORDANCE WITH CVIH BYLAWS. CONVICTIONS OF A FELONY DISQUALIFIES MEMBERSHIP ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

The Directors shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for authorized expenses of attending all meetings.
- D. A Screening Committee will review all Nominees for eligibility requirements and see that the CENTRAL VALLEY INDIAN HEALTH, INC., By-laws are followed.

The transporter will wait for 15 minutes after your scheduled departure. If you do not arrive in time, your appointment will be canceled and can be rescheduled with Tammie only. The transporter cannot transport kids to school that have missed the bus. All CVIH appointments are to be scheduled with CVIH transporter. If the CVIH transporter is unable to transport you, they will need to reschedule your appointment. This applies to all medical, dental, nutrition & referral appointments.
