

Recycled Tires and The Benefits it has on Ground and Surface Water



Tires and rim assemblies cause concerns that include West Nile virus from standing water in the tires and dangers of the tires being set on fire. Some Studies show tire rubber can cause elevated levels of zinc in plants and groundwater. Tires that are dumped in waterways can disrupt the flow of the stream or creek which can cause contamination and flooding. Leaching affects the soil around the old tire, which at first may not seem like a big problem. But if the tires is eventually moved, the soil will still have the toxins. Another major concern is groundwater. If toxins get into any water in the soil, the water can transport them to other locations, potentially harm to any animals that come in contact with the poisoned water.

Ways to Reduce Carbon Footprints

- Reduce meat in your diet and avoid wasting food.
- Walk, bike, carpool, use mass transit, or drive a best-in-class vehicle.
- Make sure your car's tires are properly inflated, fuel efficiency decreases by 0.3% for each 1 PSI decrease.²¹
- If you have a dishwasher, use it! Hand washing uses more energy and water than a machine dishwasher.²²
- Unplug electronic devices when not in use, or plug them into a power strip and turn the power strip off.²³
- Choose energy-efficient lighting and transition away from using incandescent light bulbs.²⁴
- Reduce what you send to a landfill by recycling, composting, and buying products with minimal packaging.

Composting 101

Is a natural process of decomposing organic matter like yard waste and food scraps into a nutrient-rich soil called compost. Compost Enriches the soil improves water retention and Circulation within the soil, making it healthier for plants. This is a natural fertilizer for plant growth. Composting at home allows us to divert some of that waste from landfills and turn it into something practical for our yards

YOUR APPOINTMENT MUST BE MADE AND VERIFIED WITH THE CAP DEPARTMENT *BEFORE* YOUR SPOT CAN BE RESERVED FOR THE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES. SCHEDULE APPOINTMENTS *ONLY WITH BRANDI KELLEY* 24 HOURS PRIOR FOR LOCAL TRANSPORTS AND 1 WEEK IN ADVANCE FOR FRESNO TRANSPORTS.

The transporter will wait 15 minutes after your scheduled departure. If you do not arrive on time, your appointment will be canceled and can be rescheduled *with Brandi Kelley only*. There are new rules for the transportation services, please call the transporter for a copy of revised rules. Transportation services are for Big Sandy Rancheria Tribal Members.

The transporter cannot transport kids to school that have missed the bus. All CVIH appointments are to be scheduled with CVIH transporter. If the CVIH transporter is unable to transport you, they will need to reschedule your appointment. This applies to all medical, dental, nutrition & referral appointments.
