#### **Hello Elders**

Wow! the Pow Wow was awesome. Thank you, all Elders that attended, if you didn't you surely missed out! All Elders was Honored with a handmade Necklaces made by yours truly Leann Anguiano. The necklaces were made with ghost beads/juniper berries, and they hold significant meaning to the Navajo culture. They are believed to ward off evil spirits and provide protection. They were stringed with sinew and connected with leather. We gave out 70 necklaces to all elders at the pow wow. We also honored hand drummers that were made by the tribal council with real deer hide, sinew and hand painted by the tribal council.

June will be a busy month for elders we have several events coming up. I have attached flyers for the upcoming events.

June 7, 2025 is Honored Elders Day in Sacramento. If you would like to attend and need a ride please contact Matt Munoz. Honored Elders Day is an exciting one-day trip up and back we leave the casino parking lot around 6am and return around 5pm. They have the State Indian Museum open for free entry that day. They also have elder lunch, cultural sharing, speakers, dancers and craft booths. You will see elders from all over. On the flyer is a QR code that you can register.

June 13th 2025 is Tachi Elders gathering at Santa Rosa Rancheria. They have invited all BSR elders to attend. The Theme this year is Disney & Marvel so come dressed as your favorite character. ## **BSR Environmental Department June 2025**

#### **Climate Change-Wildfire**

Warming planets and changes to the atmosphere mean more wildfires, as our ozone layer is thinning this will cause spikes in unhealthy air pollution due to smoke. Climate change brings more drought and higher temperatures that make it easy for fires to start and spread, and in turn those blazes release more climate-changing carbon into the atmosphere as they burn through forests. Climate change has been a key factor in increasing the risk and extent of wildfires in the Western United States, Wildfire risk depends on a number of factors, including temperature, soil moisture, and the presence of trees, shrubs, and other potential fuel. All these factors have strong direct or indirect ties to climate variability and climate change. Climate change enhances the drying of organic matter in forests (the material that burns and spreads wildfire), and has doubled the number of large fires between 1984 and 2025 in the western United States.

### Solid Waste Management-Summer

Dealing with warmer temperatures is the perfect condition for fire especially if certain items are not disposed of properly. Even without the presence of flammable material, the dangers of compacted miscellaneous waste and recycling is a fire risk. Oil soaked rags, aerosol cans, propane tanks, batteries, e-waste, fertilizer, and even lighter fluid are often discarded improperly. Under the right conditions some of these items can spontaneously bust. For others, like lithium batteries all it takes is a little heat and friction from being pushed around in a container. And in the certain conditions, a single spark can ignite a blaze. Please contact our BSR solid waste staff to ensure any questionable items are discarded properly.

### Teach your kids about sustainability.

- Recycle.
- Pick up trash.
- Sort the garbage.
- Plant a garden.
- Make laundry products at home.
- Reuse items for crafts.
- Make homemade art items.

#### Composting

Composting is possible during the winter months. To start, one of the most important things you can do in the fall/winter is gather leaves for use in composting. Leaves and pine needles are excellent brown, carbon-rich materials that improve compost pile aeration and reduce odors. Leaves can be stockpiled in bags or bins for use throughout the summer months. If leaves are to be stored in an open bin, you might find it helpful to cover them with a tarp in order to keep them from getting wet and matting together.



Recycling old mattresses? June 25<sup>th</sup> bring mattresses and box springs to the BSR transfer station.




